INTRODUCTION

Summer 1939, Hitler's power is growing and tensions between the UK and Germany are at boiling point. The Augusta Victoria College, a finishing school for daughters and god-daughters of the Nazi elite on the south-coast of England, is under close scrutiny after the mysterious disappearance of their teacher Mr Wheatley. The school governess, Miss Rocholl (JUDI DENCH), hires journeyman teacher Thomas Miller (EDDIE IZZARD) to replace Wheatley and help prepare the girls for the Anglo-German fellowship.

Thomas slowly raises the suspicions of Ilse Keller (CARLA JURI), the girls' German tutor, who has secrets of her own. Caught in the crossfires, Thomas is framed for murder and goes on the run to clear his name and uncover Ilse's true plan for the girls. Can he stop her before its too late?

SIX MINUTES TO MIDNIGHT is a period thriller inspired by the real Augusta Victoria College for girls on the south coast-of England that taught German girls throughout the 1930s and only closed at the outbreak of WW2. The school was run on Nazi ideals throughout Hitler's governance as demonstrated by the school badge, a Swastika on one side and a Union Jack on the other.

The real school was in Bexhill-on-Sea, Eddie Izzard's home town, who has been toying with this idea for many years and through his creative partnership with Celyn Jones of Mad as Birds brought the idea to life.

SIX MINUTES TO MIDNIGHT is directed by **Andy Goddard** (*Downton Abbey, Carnival Row, Set Fire to the Stars*) and stars household favourites **Eddie Izzard** (*Victoria & Abdul, Ocean's Thirteen*), **Judi Dench** (*Murder on the Orient Express, Skyfall*) and **Jim Broadbent** (*Paddington 2, Bridget Jones*) alongside **Carla Juri** (*Blade Runner 2049, Wetlands*), **David Schofield** (*Gladiator, Pirates of the Caribbean: Dead Man's Chest*), **James D'Arcy** (*Cloud Atlas, Dunkirk*) and **Celyn Jones** (*Submergence, Set Fire to the Stars*).

PRODUCTION NOTES

ORIGIN STORY

Six Minutes to Midnight is set in Bexhill on Sea where Eddie Izzard's family is from and where he spent a lot of time as a child. His connection to the town and his success led the Bexhill Museum to ask him to become a patron. On Eddie's first visit to the museum the curator there, Julian PORTER, showed Eddie the school badge from the real Augusta-Victoria College for girls sparking the whole idea for the film.



A Swastika in the right hand corner and a union jack in the left hand corner is an arresting and disconcerting image which piqued Eddie's curiosity. Through conversations with local historians and the museum he discovered the school was a finishing school for daughters and god-daughters of important Germans, including senior members of the Nazi party; Himmler's god-daughter and Von-Ribbentrop's daughter attended the school in the 1930s. This fascinating anomaly in British history felt like it had been swept under the carpet and Eddie wanted to explore a world where a slice of Nazi Germany existed on the south coast of England against the backdrop of the most seismic event in our history,

However, it was not until running into fellow actor Celyn Jones in Cannes to whom he pitched the idea that the project came a reality. Celyn and Mad as Birds were so excited by the idea they began work on the script with Eddie in the next few weeks and the pieces of the puzzle began to fall into place.

THE ARTISTIC VISION

Director Andy Goddard was drawn to the project on it's premise and creative team, the idea of working with Celyn Jones again and getting to work on Eddie's first screenplay was an exciting prospect but the content even more so. The idea that these teenage girls lived on the south coast of England in the run up to the outbreak of the war was fascinating. What was their experience of England at that time, how did England treat them, how connected

to Germany and national socialism were they? Andy wanted to explore these thoughts and questions especially as they have significant parallels to current political events and increasing nationalistic sentiments. The desire to connect a story set on the brink of WW2 to current politics became a strong sentiment held by the whole creative team; the desire to display fascism as a human problem not a "German" problem and highlight the fact we need to look at that key period of history as a cautionary tale of "simplistic politics". "There - but for the grace of humanity - go all of us".

Beyond the politics the team were focussed on creating an entertaining a rich, ambitious, entertaining story with a real message at its core; people are all capable of good and bad.

Andy was visually excited by using a quintessential British seaside town as the canvas for this story, it's such an iconic setting and landscape of a bygone era. Also the juxtaposition between the fun and whimsy of a seaside town with the political machinations of war is a sets up a dynamic and unique backdrop. These locations were key to Andy Goddard to really capture the spirit of the time as well as introducing small visual details indicating Britain was preparing for war that happen in the background of the main narrative, creating an incredibly rich setting.

Another key element for Andy was the casting of the the six key German school girls as their personalities and group dynamic would be so key for the story. Each character has their own individual characteristics but how they interact together is sometimes more important. The idea was to really focus on the fact they're just teenage girls, they have insecurities, they're silly, they can be mean, they can be sweet and they are also very impressionable. This was at the forefront of Andy's mind throughout casting, none of the girls should be one thing but within the group dynamic they each had a role to play, Astrid the bully, Gretel the outcast, Sigrid the fool etc. so meeting them in person was as informative as their auditions and screen-tests as he could really get a gauge of each person and how they would operate amongst the group.

Andy described the process as "one the most exciting things I've had to cast"... "I saw about 70 girls on tape" and "narrowed it down to 12" then I went to Berlin to do the screen tests and found our key six who have surpassed all my expectations they are fantastic. Audiences may come to see Judi, Eddie and Jim but I hope they walk away with eager to see our young German actresses in whatever they do next.

One of the other key visual elements of the story world was the school, it was almost a character in itself. It was hard to find somewhere that we could truly make our own as most old stately homes are hotels now or institutions of some kind so to stumble across Gelli Aur in Carmarthenshire, a privately owned house in the process of renovation it felt like it was meant to be. Finding the school shaped the visual thumbprint of the story world and led to the decision that the girls would be isolated from the rest of their world and hauled up in the school away from an England whose sentiments towards the Germans were less than kind, even young teenage Germans.

CHEATING WALES AS SOUTH COAST

The whole film was shot in Wales thanks to the support of the Welsh Government and Ffilm Cymru but it did pose an interesting challenge to re-create the South Coast of England in Wales. Llandudno in North Wales offered the Victorian seaside world with it's pier, promenade, victorian buildings and beaches and Carmarthenshire gave us the unspoiled sprawling coastlines, our school and the all important "Pevensey Castle" location which was actually Llansteffan Castle. Although this meant a lot of travelling which was tough on cast & crew the film benefits from the beautiful Welsh countryside shot in the best summer England has seen in the last 20 years, encapsulating the idea of the girls' "last summer" a metaphor for the end of their childhood.

BIOGRAPHIES – CAST

EDDIE IZZARD – THOMAS MILLER (CO-WRITER/PRODUCER)

One of the most celebrated comics of his generation, Eddie Izzard has also developed an equally stellar reputation as a film, television, and stage actor and political activist.

Izzard made his West End stage debut in 1993 with his one-man show *Live at the Ambassadors*, in which he received an Olivier Award nomination for Outstanding Achievement. *Live at the Ambassadors* was followed by a succession of critically-acclaimed shows including *Unrepeatable*, *Definite Article*, *Glorious* and *Dress to Kill*, which earned him a New York Drama Desk Award and two Emmy Awards. *Circle*, *Sexie* and *Stripped* all followed and then came *Force Majeure* which became the most extensive comedy tour ever with Eddie playing to 45 countries on five continents including all 50 of the United States. Eddie now tours his show in four languages English, French, German and Spanish.

On television, Izzard has appeared in the crime noir series, *Powers* and has captivated audiences with his masterful performance as 'Dr. Abel Gideon' in Bryan Fuller's series, *Hannibal*. Izzard also starred in and served as a producer on the critically acclaimed FX Networks series, *The Riches*. His other notable television credits include *Castles in the Sky*, *Treasure Island*, and *Lost Christmas*.

Highlights from Izzard's film career include *Boychoir*, *Valkyrie*, *Ocean's Thirteen* and *Ocean's Twelve*, *Across the Universe*, *Mystery Men*, *Shadow of the Vampire*, *The Cat's Meow* and most recently *Victoria and Abdul*, where Izzard played the role of Bertie, Prince of Wales alongside Judi Dench as Queen Victoria.

His dramatic stage appearances include David Mamet's *Race* and *The Cryptogram*, the title role in Marlowe's *Edward II*, *900 Oneonta*, and *A Day in the Death of Joe Egg* in London and on Broadway, which garnered him a Tony nomination for Best Actor.

In 2010, *Believe: The Eddie Izzard Story* received an Emmy Award nomination. His companion-piece autobiography, *Believe Me*, entered the top ten in the Sunday Times Best-seller list and the New York Times Best-seller list.

On March 20, 2016, Izzard completed running 27 marathons in 27 days in South Africa as a tribute to Nelson Mandela and raised over £2.6 million (\$3.3 million) for Sport Relief, a charity that helps improve the lives of people in impoverished countries. In 2009, Izzard ran 43 marathons in 51 days through England, Wales, Northern Ireland and Scotland for charity and helped raise £1.8 million (\$2.7 million) for Sport Relief.

Eddie has just finished filming his first co-written film, the thriller *Six Minutes to Midnight*. He continues to be an active supporter and member of The Labour Party and is currently in the middle of his new stand-up world tour *Wunderbar*.

JUDI DENCH – MISS ROCHOLL

Since playing Ophelia in *Hamlet* at The Old Vic Theatre over 60 years ago, Judi Dench has garnered wide popular and critical admiration for a career marked by outstanding performances in both classical and contemporary roles. She has won numerous major awards – including an Academy Award, ten BAFTA Awards and a record eight Laurence Olivier Awards – for work on both stage and screen, and in recognition of her many achievements she received an OBE (Order of the British Empire) in 1970, became a DBE (Dame of the British Empire) in 1988, and in 2005 was awarded a Companion of

Honour. She has also received the Japan Arts Association's prestigious Praemium Imperiale Laureate Award for Film and Theatre.

Dame Judi recently wrapped on *Blithe Spirit* and Disney's *Artemis Fowl*, directed by Ed Hall and Kenneth Branagh respectively, and will soon be seen in feature film *Cats*, directed by Tom Hooper. In the past years she has appeared in Kenneth Branagh's *Murder on the Orient Express*, for Twentieth Century Fox and starred in *Victoria & Abdul*, directed by Stephen Frears for Working Title and Focus Features. This latter performance was nominated for a Golden Globe, SAG and AACTA International Award. This is the second time in her career she has played Queen Victoria. For her first such performance, directed by John Madden in *Mrs Brown*, she won BAFTA and Golden Globe awards and was nominated for an Academy Award.

Dame Judi received an Academy Award and a BAFTA Award, both for Best Supporting Actress, for another magisterial performance as Queen Elizabeth I in *Shakespeare In Love*, and she has received Academy Award nominations for performances in a further five films: Lasse Hallstrom's *Chocolat*, for which she was also nominated for a Golden Globe; *Iris*, directed by Richard Eyre, for which she also won a BAFTA Award; *Mrs Henderson Presents*, directed by Stephen Frears, for which she was further nominated at the BAFTAs and the Golden Globes; *Notes on a Scandal*, again directed by Richard Eyre, which also brought her BAFTA and Golden Globe nominations; and *Philomena*, directed by Stephen Frears and co-starring Steve Coogan, for which she also received BAFTA, Golden Globe and SAG award nominations.

Dame Judi is recognised globally for her legendary role as M in seven James Bond films, from *Goldeneye* to *Skyfall*.

Her other film work includes *Tea With Mussolini*, directed by Franco Zeffirelli; *A Room With a View* and *A Handful of Dust*, both of which brought her BAFTA Awards for Best Supporting Actress; *84 Charing Cross Road*, directed by David Jones; *Henry V* and *Hamlet*, both directed Kenneth Branagh; *Nine*, directed by Rob Marshall; *Jane Eyre*, directed by Cary Fukunaga; *My Week with Marilyn*, directed by Simon Curtis; *J. Edgar*, directed by Clint Eastwood; the hugely successful India-set comedy *The Best Exotic Marigold Hotel*, and its sequel *The Second Best Exotic Marigold Hotel*, both directed by John Madden; Roald Dahl's *Esio Trot*, opposite Dustin Hoffman; and *Miss Peregrine's Home for Peculiar Children*, directed by Tim Burton.

Dame Judi is also revered for her television work. Most recently she starred as Cecily, Duchess of York, in *The Hollow Crown* for the BBC, and past credits include: *The Last of the Blonde Bombshells*, for which she received BAFTA and Golden Globe Awards and an Emmy Award nomination; the long-running hit BBC sitcom *As Time Goes By*; and the critically acclaimed *Cranford* and *Cranford: Return to Cranford*, for which she received a number of major award nominations.

Dame Judi's achievements on screen are mirrored by her celebrated career on stage. She received an Olivier Award for Best Supporting Actress for her most recent role as Paulina in Kenneth Branagh's celebrated West End production of *The Winter's Tale*, and she has previously won Olivier Awards for *Macbeth* and *Juno and the Paycock* for the RSC; *Pack of Lies* at the London Lyric; and *Anthony and Cleopatra*, *Absolute Hell*, and *A Little Night Music*, all at The National Theatre. Her performance in David Hare's *Amy's View*, directed by Richard Eyre, brought her a Critics Circle Award and an Olivier Award nomination when it played in London at The National and Aldwych, followed by a Tony Award for Best Actress when the play transferred to Broadway. Her other theatre credits include: *The Royal Family*, directed by Peter Hall; *The Breath of Life*, directed by Howard Davies and co-starring Dame Maggie Smith; *All's Well That Ends Well*, for the RSC; *Hay Fever*, directed by Peter Hall; *The Merry Wives of Windsor*, for the RSC; *Madame de Sade*, directed by Michael Grandage for The Donmar West End; Peter Hall's production of *A Midsummer Night's Dream* at the Rose Theatre, Kingston; *Peter and Alice*, directed by Michael Grandage in the West End; and *The Vote*, directed by Josie Rourke for The Donmar in 2015, which was also broadcast live on UK General Election night in a landmark television event.

CARLA JURI – ILSE KELLER

Carla's international star has risen since starring in the critically acclaimed German film *Wetlands* directed by David Wnendt. Carla was recently seen in Denis Villeneuve's *Blade Runner 2049*, opposite Ryan Gosling and Harrison Ford and will soon be seen in the title role in the film *Dear Agnes* for director Daniel Alfredson. Her other films include *Walking To Paris* for director Peter Greenway, the Sundance hit *Morris From America* for director Chad Hartigan in which she starred opposite Craig Robinson and *Brimstone* for Dutch filmmaker Martin Koolhoven, opposite Dakota Fanning, Kit Harrington and Guy Pearce, which premiered at the 2016 Venice Film Festival. She was also cast in the title role in *Paula* the biopic of renowned German artist **Paula Modersohn Becker**. Carla recently completed back to back features; *Six Minutes to Midnight* opposite Judi Dench and Eddie Izzard and *When Hitler Stole Pink Rabbit* for Academy Award winning director Caroline Link. She recently filmed Romola Garai's *Amulet* opposite Imelda Staunton.

JAMES D'ARCY – CAPTAIN DREY

James D'Arcy, an actor, writer and director trained at the London Academy of Music & Dramatic Art where he went on to star in plays *As You Like It*, *Wild Honey*, *The Freedom of the City*, and *Sherlock Holmes*. In 2002, he received a nomination for an Ian Charleson Award for his performance in *Edward II*. On the big screen James was recently seen in Tomas Alfredson's crime drama *The Snowman*, with Michael Fassbender and J.K. Simmons and on television we saw him as Anson in *Homeland*.

Additional feature film credits include James McTeigue's thriller *Survivor*; the comedy *Let's Be Cops*, opposite Damon Wayans Jr. and Jake Johnson; *Jupiter Ascending* and *Cloud Atlas*, both for the Wachowskis; the biopic *Hitchcock*, opposite Anthony Hopkins; the historical drama *W.E.*; and Peter Weir's *Master and Commander: The Far Side of the World*.

On television, D'Arcy played leading roles in ABC's *Agent Carter*, opposite Hayley Atwell, and A&E's serial killer drama *Those Who Kill*, alongside Chloë Sevigny. He was also seen as the villain in season 2 of the critically acclaimed UK series *Broadchurch*.

James is currently in post on his directorial debut *Made in Italy* starring Liam Neeson.

DAVID SCHOFIELD – COLONEL SMITH

David Schofield trained at the London Academy of Music and Dramatic Art and since, has become a household name.

Television includes *DaVinci's Demons*, *The Shadow Line*, Netflix's *The Last Kingdom* and *Injustice*. On the big screen he is best known as "Falco" in *Gladiator* (2000), "McQueen" in *From Hell* (2001), "Mr. Mercer" in *The Pirates of the Caribbean* franchise. Other film includes starring in Garth Davis' feature film *Mary Magdalene* (2017), *The Wolfman* (2010), *The Last of the Mohicans* (1992) and *An American Werewolf in London* (1981) and most recently "Clement Atlee" in the Oscar nominated *Darkest Hour* (2017).

Schofield's distinguished stage career has seen him performing for the Royal Shakespeare Company and a long associate with the Royal National Theatre. He has also played numerous roles in plays and musicals in the West End.

DIRECTOR – ANDY GODDARD (CO-WRITER)

Andy Goddard is a writer and director working in film and television. His debut feature *Set Fire To The Stars* (2014) was nominated for the Michael Powell Award for Best British Feature and won three BAFTA Cymru Awards from its seven nominations. His television credits include *Downtown Abbey*, *Daredevil*, *The Punisher* and *Altered Carbon* for Netflix. Andy is currently director and co-executive producer on *Carnival Row* for Amazon.

WRITER - CELYN JONES

Celyn Jones is a critically acclaimed actor and BAFTA nominated screenwriter from Wales. The times referred to him as 'the powerhouse writer-performer behind the greatest Dylan Thomas biopic yet'.

Celyn wrote *Set Fire to the Stars*, which starred Elijah Wood. The film has had nominations for the Michael Powell award for the Best British Film, EIFF & MIFF Audience awards and won three BAFTA Cymru awards.

Since then he has written the noir-thriller, *The Vanishing*, released in 2019 starring Gerard Butler & Peter Mullan and has co-written Eddie Izzard's first screenplay, *Six Minutes to Midnight* starring Judi Dench and Jim Broadbent.

Celyn is also a character actor in high demand, having recently acted opposite Alicia Vikander in Wim Wenders' *Submergence* and played Winston Churchill in Agustí Villaronga's *Born A King*.

DIRECTOR OF PHOTOGRAPHY – CHRIS SEAGER BSC

Award winning British 'Cinematographer' Chris Seager BSC began his journey in the movie industry with Film School and BBC Television Film Department. During his formative years as a Cinematographer he shot many critically acclaimed documentaries and moved into TV Movies where he excelled in films like *Skallakrigg*, both a BAFTA and Prix Italia WINNER. In 1994 he completed the shooting of director John Schlesinger's much applauded movie *Cold Comfort Farm*. He resigned from the BBC and became a freelance Director of Photography.

He was subsequently invited by his peers to become a full member of the prestigious British Society of Cinematographers [BSC].

His Television Drama credits include many popular 'period dramas' such as TNT/Paramount's *The Alienist*, HBO's *Game of Thrones* [Series 3], Starz's *The White Princess*, NBC's *Dracula*, BBC's *The Way We Live Now*, *Call the Midwife*, *Madame Bovary*, *The Younger Visiter*, *Hamlet*, *Archangel* and the ABC's musical *Galavant*.

His 'contemporary dramas' include director David Yates three award winning dramas, *State of Play*, *Sex Traffic* and *The Girl in the Café* along with other notable dramas such as *Five Daughters*, *The Hour* and *Undercover*.

His many international movie film credits have notably included *Beautiful Thing*, *Fever Pitch*, the successful box office 'horror flic' *White Noise*, the British kids action movie *Alex Rider – Operation Stormbreaker*, Paul Schrader's political thriller *The Walker*, teen comedy *Wild Child* and romantic comedy *New in Town*. He teamed up with Michael Keaton who starred and directed the well received *The Merry Gentleman*.

Chris has recently collaborated with director Andy Goddard on three movies, *Set Fire to the Stars*, *A Kind of Murder* and *Six Minutes to Midnight*. He and Andy also worked on Amazon's *Carnival Row*.

PRODUCTION DESIGNER – CANDIDA OTTON

Candida has worked extensively in the UK across Film and Television.

Candida's television credits include the large scale ITV period drama, *Mr Selfridge* (2016), series 2 of Abi Morgan's *The Split* (2019) and *Tess of the D'Urbervilles* (2008) with Gemma Arterton and Eddie Redmayne.

Candida recently designed Adrian Shergold's *Funny Cow* starring Maxine Peake.

COSTUME DESIGNER – LUCINDA WRIGHT

Lucinda has worked on a variety of contemporary and period productions for Film and Television.

Lucinda's television credits include the rebooting of the series *Dr Who* in 2004 starring Christopher Eccleston and Billie Piper, which won her a Welsh BAFTA and an RTS nomination.

The following productions of *Fanny Hill* (2008), *Miss Marie Lloyd* (2008) and the Victorian thriller *The Suspicions of Mr Whicher* (2014) starring Paddy Constantine and Olivia Colman gained Lucinda a BAFTA nomination for her designs.

Lucinda also worked on *House Cocktail* which won the Soho House Short Film Competition in 2012.

The production of *Enid* (2009) starring Helena Bonham Carter resulted in a RTS nomination for Lucinda. The *Maigret* series (2015-2017) starring Rowan Atkinson as the french detective, shows Lucinda's wonderful range of period designs.

Prior to the feature *Six Minutes to Midnight* (2020), Lucinda worked on the film *Deathwatch* (2002) which starred Jamie Bell and Andy Serkis, and was set during the First World War.

BENJAMIN WALLFISCH – COMPOSER

Award-winning film composer Marc Streitenfeld is known for his uniquely diverse style that includes pure melodic orchestral compositions, unusual instrumentations and haunting, organic sound creations. He has worked on many high-profile Hollywood features as well as critically acclaimed independent films.

Streitenfeld relocated to Los Angeles at age 19 from Munich, Germany and initially assisted Academy-Award winning film composer Hans Zimmer and then worked with Carter Burwell.

Legendary director Ridley Scott offered Streitenfeld his first composing job when he asked him to write the score for *A Good Year*. Streitenfeld has written five film scores for Scott including the BAFTA nominated score for *American Gangster*, for which he won the prestigious „Discovery of the Year“ Award at the World Soundtrack Awards, the Sci-Fi adventure *Prometheus* and the action adventure *Robin Hood*. He has also been recognized for his work with three ASCAP Film and Television Music Awards and two International Film Music Critics Award nominations.

Streitenfeld has worked with numerous other highly regarded directors, including Marc Forster on *All I See Is You*, Joe Carnahan on the action drama *The Grey*, and Andrew Dominik on the crime thriller *Killing Them Softly*.

CASTING DIRECTOR – COLIN JONES CSA

Colin is a UK based casting director who has worked on over 70 films and TV shows. As part of his role, he was responsible for the delivery of the company's commercial growth.

Prior to that he was the youngest major radio market Programme Director (Metro Radio) and then Managing Director (Radio City) as well as having an EMAP group-wide role across 8 "Magic AM" stations.

He co-founded a regional theatre production company which secured deals to tell the stories of Liverpool and Celtic Football Clubs which have now played to over 100,000 people.
